DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The 2019-20 academic year began auspiciously, with the Russell Construction crew hard at work creating a stable foundation for our new museum building. The museum staff evolved. Dr. Joyce Tsai was promoted to the position of Chief Curator. Dr. Kimberly Datchuk became our first Curator of Learning and Engagement. Rebecca Hanssens-Reed joined us as Administrative Services Coordinator, and Derek Nnuro, a graduate of the fiction program at The University of Iowa Writers' Workshop, became the museum's first Associate Writer. Curator of Education Dale Fisher and Legacies for Iowa Curator Vero Rose Smith left us to take up teaching positions.

As we prepared to move the museum's world-class collections home and install a stunning inaugural exhibition, we had help from three graduate assistants-Thomas Ho, Jackie Banigan, and Nicole Davis—and nine undergraduate interns, all of whom gained valuable pre-professional experience. Mural, was featured in an exhibition at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, We continued to offer engaging educational programming to faculty, students and staff at the University of lowa, members of the public, and lowa teachers and schoolchildren. In early March, Chief Curator Tsai and Associate Professor of English, Dr. Jennifer Buckley co-chaired the Obermann Center for Advanced Studies symposium What Can the Museum Become? When the pandemic arrived in Iowa just a week later, the museum quickly moved our programming online to keep audience members connected and engaged. Our undergraduate gallery assistants created art activities, puzzles, and coloring sheets for children to work on at home. Miraculously, the new museum building progressed on schedule and the construction crew stayed healthy. In May, the Stanley's advisory board approved the museum's first collections plan.

I am both humbled and profoundly proud of the excellent work done by the Stanley's staff, board, and student employees, the persistence and care of the UI Facilities and Russell Construction teams, and the unwavering support of the museum's friends and supporters. Together, you carried us through this challenging year.








WHAT CAN MUSEUMS BECOME?
